Effect of Snow Days on 2013-2014 School Calendar

Bangor Public Schools have been forced to cancel school for eleven days so far this year. The State of Michigan allows schools six days per year that need not be made up. In the past, the number of days missed beyond what was allowed by the State were limited to what was needed to ensure the 1, 098 hours of instruction required by the State. This year, the law has changed to require all days beyond the allowable six to be made up, regardless of having completed the required 1098 hours of instruction. We have missed five days over the allowable six, and therefore must add five days to the end of our original schedule,. This means we will end this year with a half day on Friday June 13th, instead of Friday, June 6th. Graduation will remain as originally scheduled for Sunday June 1st.
