## **OPERATION SCRIBBLE**

It began with a box. .

The idea started in 2001, when Matt and Emily Leinwand joined their father, then a pediatric surgeon in California, for his weekend rounds in a local hospital. The 5 and 6 year old children witnessed how sad and unhappy the young patients were and asked what they could do to help. Children who stayed at the hospital needed activities to occupy their time and cheer them up, his two children concluded. They put a cardboard box on their porch and asked family members who visited to bring crayons and coloring books to fill the box.

Operation Scribble, a non-profit organization that distributes toys, games, stuffed animals, and movies to children staying in the hospital has grown, reaching children in Kalamazoo, Los Angeles, Boston, and Philadelphia. As of last December, the organization had collected more than 115,000 new crayons, 10,000 coloring books and more than 5,700 games and toys.

For the last 4 years, members of the Bangor Middle School Boys 7th and 8th grade basketball teams have participated in this annual drive to support Operation Scribble. This year the team members collected over 400
