## Seniors: apply for scholarships!!!

Scholarship and senior award recipients are already being selected for the Class of 2014. There are a multitude of opportunities out there to apply for by Bangor High School seniors. While many of the opportunities are available nationally or statewide, there are numerous ones awarded locally as well.

Our counseling office also prints a monthly scholarship flyer. This flyer is available to any senior that chooses to pick it up from the counseling center.

The key to securing any scholarship is the application process. A senior has to apply to be considered. Each year we have some disappointed individuals – either students or parents – that just can't understand why they were left out. Most times the reason is that no application was ever completed. To be considered, a senior must complete an application, follow the directions in doing so and meet the deadline. Many scholarships also require one or more letters of recommendation. These letters are usually from a teacher, coach or administrator. It is critical that seniors ask for these recommendations well in advance if they expect a quality, thoughtful letter. Asking at the last minute on the day that the application is due is not a good plan and may

be disappointing if a staff member is unable to complete it.

Senior recipients of other awards are also currently being selected. Many of these awards do not include monetary value, but carry only the prestige of earning the award. The Wendy's Heisman, the Daughter's of the American Revolution (DAR), and the Herald-Palladium Academic All-Stars are just a few of the senior awards. Other awards are based solely on a formula that may combine national test scores and grade point average of the core academic subjects.

Selection for recipients begins with a process. Each award or scholarship is unique in how seniors are selected. Some require voting of all staff members. Some are selected by a committee of family members, trustees or board of directors of the scholarship. Some are selected by groups totally outside of Bangor. Whatever the process, it is democratic in nature with guidelines and procedures that are followed per the scholarship. In 99% of the cases, the senior must apply in order to be considered.

The deadline for completed applications this year is Tuesday, April 1, 2014. So seniors, stop in and get your applications today! You won't be considered unless you apply!

## Regional Spelling Bee Results

On Tuesday, February 11, three students represented Bangor Middle School at the Regional Cloverleaf Spelling Bee at Lake Michigan College in Benton Harbor. The students were Le'onna Wallace, Madison Perry, and Nikolis Hoots. There were a total of 60 students participating in the Spelling Bee. Le'onna placed eleventh out of the sixty students. Madison and Nikolis were unfortunately eliminated during the first round, but they put in a great effort.

We especially would like to thank the Bangor Alumni Foundation for sponsoring our spelling bee. They have always been tremendously supportive of our spelling program.

Words they had to spell were begonia, palette (which got confused with pallet), netherlander, susceptible, bellicose, and trepak. The students were given a Spell-it Booklet which is used for the National Spelling Bee in Washington, D.C. in May. It contains tens of thousands of words students need to learn.
