Good Luck Middle School Spellers!

The Middle School Spelling Bee will take place on January 5th, at 6:30 pm in the middle school library. This year's contestants are Logan Page, Abel Munoz, Sammy Glidden-Fry, Michael Hardester, Keith Kueny, and Ramsey Reyes. The spelling bee is conducted in rounds. Each speller will be asked to spell a word. Once the spellers are given a word, the may ask for the language of origin of the word, a definition of the word, the word used in a sentence, and the part of speech. Spellers are encouraged to say the word first, spell it, and then say it again when finished spelling it. This will let the judges and pronouncer know that the student is finished. The round of play begins with a practice round. A student will remain in the bee until he/she spells three words incorrectly. Once this occurs, the student drops out of the competition, unless the competition is down to the last two spellers. All spellers eliminated in the same round are tied for the same place. After the champion has been determined, spelling bee officials may opt to conduct a tiebreaker to


