Head Varsity Coach: Travis Farris

Coach Farris is in his second year of teaching physical education & health at Bangor High School. Coach Farris graduated from Olivet College in 2012. He was a four year letterman and Captain of the Olivet College Football Team. This is Coach Farris's first year as the head varsity coach at Bangor. He also was the head varsity coach at Martin High School where he ended the longest losing streak in the state of Michigan, 56 game losing streak. 

This year's season will include the fall play, The Curious Savage, on November 10 and 11, and the spring musical Seussical, the Musical in March. Among her many other duties,

Auditions for The Curious Savage were held on September 18 and 19. Eleven actors and nine crew members were named to the company. Among the company members are seniors Madison Kueny, Faviola Diaz and Araceli Hernandez.

"I'm super excited!" Said Kueny about her lead role as Ethel Savage. "I've always been into drama because my mom was president of the Drama Club when she was in high school. I got into it in 2nd grade and been into it ever since." Kueny, whose favorite musical is Mamma Mia! hopes it gets bigger at Bangor and that more kids get into it. "I hope it (the show) blows people away!"

Faviola Diaz was approached by Sargeant to learn the position of Assistant Stage Manager with the aim to learn more about production. "I'm just excited to bring some positivity and entertainment back to our community that we all love so much!" Favi also hopes to have theatre management as part of an independent study this year.

Araceli Hernandez originally auditioned, but chose instead to take on the role of hair and makeup person. This show will involve some special effect makeup to make Kueny look nearly 70 years old, as well as styling the ladies' hair into early 1940's styles. Says Hernandez: "I am scared of messing up their hair before opening act!"

The Curious Savage, By John Patrick is described on the DPS (licensing company)

website as: Mrs. Savage has been left ten million dollars by her husband and wants to make the best use of it, in spite of her grownup stepchildren's efforts to get their hands on it. Knowing that the widow's wealth is now in negotiable securities, and seeing they cannot get hold of the fortune, the stepchildren commit her to a sanatorium hoping to "bring her to her senses." In the sanatorium, Mrs. Savage meets various social misfits, men and women who just cannot adjust themselves to life, people who need the help Mrs. Savage can provide. In getting to know them, she realizes that she will find happiness with them and plans to spend the rest of her life as one of them. But when the doctor tells her there is no reason why she should remain, she hesitates to go out into a hard world where people seem ready to do anything for money. The self-seeking stepchildren are driven to distraction by their vain efforts to browbeat Mrs. Savage, but she preserves her equanimity and leads them on a merry chase. At last her friends conspire to get rid of her stepchildren, and through their simple belief in the justice of her cause, they enable Mrs. Savage to carry out her plans to establish a fund to help others realize their hopes and dreams. The dominant mood is high comedy, and the audience is left with a feeling that the neglected virtues of kindness and affection have not been entirely lost in a world that seems, at times, motivated only by greed and
