Dear Viking Families,

As the Holiday season is passing by, we would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year. We are looking forward to a great start to 2018 with our students and staff. One initiative that will be quickly approaching is the 1:1 chromebook for all students in grades 8-12.

Each student in grades 8-12 will be receiving a chromebook with a carrying case and MiFi device. The MiFi device is a wireless router that acts as a hotspot for internet access. The chromebooks will be issued to the students just as a textbook would. The students are responsible for the chromebooks and will return them at the end of the school year. The chromebooks will be monitored by Bangor Public Schools and will have restrictions to certain websites.

Insurance is available and will be requested of each student. The cost for insurance through the school for the chromebook will be based on your student's lunch application. If your student has free lunch, the cost will be \$10.00 upon pickup. If your student has a reduced lunch, the cost will be \$15.00 upon pickup. Lastly, if your student is a full price lunch, the cost will be \$25.00

The chromebooks will be available for pick up in the High School Library on January 9th from 3:00 - 5:00 pm, January 10th from 5:00 - 7:00 pm, January 18th from 12:00 - 3:00 pm, or by appointment by contacting the High School office.
