Once a month the District Content Leadership Team meet to discuss various matters regarding the district policies. The members of this group are the district content leaders for each core subject, district chair of the parent involvement committee, building level administrators, members of the school board, and our superintendent. Meetings are typically held on Monday after school releases for the day. Parents are invited to attend school improvement meetings at each building and their responses to a district parent survey are used in creation of our individual building plans as well as the district plan.

Specifically in regards to Parent Involvement, parents are requested from the PTO and the meetings are open to any parents that are interested in attending. There is one paid position for a parent. We meet in the evenings prior to board meetings to accommodate work schedules and increase attendance of parents and board members. All meetings open to the public, sharing curriculum duties throughout district to involve more teachers, p.d. with focus on collaboration.

The parent involvement group consists of teachers, counselors, administrators, parents and board members. All members work together to determine our focus point and the process that we will utilize to achieve that goal. Together we provide feedback and refine our process and goals.

District core content (in addition to the technology department) leaders meet with the building content leaders to assure that their individual building plans, in addition to the district plan, is being followed.

Building content leaders meet with teachers of their subject area to assure that the goals written in the school improvement plan are being followed and the necessary steps are being taken to achieve the gains written in the plan.
