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To Bangor Public School Community,

As a community we are all collectively mourning and absolutely devastated to hear, read and watch about the horrific events at Oxford High School. We are keeping not only the Oxford Community

n our thoughts but also all those that are dealing with the aftermath of the incident that is long reaching across not only the state but the nation. This week there were many schools in Michigan closed due to threats later deemed not to be credible. In each of

those instances, administration and law enforcement are obligated to investigate, even if found not credible. Every threat against a school and its members while at school must be taken seriously and this takes away valuable resources both from the school, the police and then ultimately the criminal justice system. These situations, even if found not credible, may result in student school discipline and potential criminal charges.

We urge all community members to follow these Dos and Don'ts of School Safety:

1. DO: Speak up immediately if you see or hear something concerning. Students can confidently tell a trusted adult at school or confidentially report through OK2SAY (text 652729 or call 8-555-OK2SAY).

2. DO: Follow the simple security procedures in every Bangor Public School building at all times; be where you are supposed to be during the school day. Only use the main/secure entrances during the school

3. DO NOT: "Hide" or congregate in bathrooms or locker rooms.

4. DO NOT: Prop or open other doors, even for people you may know. 5. DO NOT: Re-post and/or share threats on your social media. This type of behavior creates more fear and spreads false information. If a threat is seen online, report it to administration or police *immediately*. Students need to be aware that law enforcement has the tools to track down individuals who make any threats, even from newly created or anonymous social media accounts.

6. DO NOT: Make 'jokes' about school violence or weapons of any kind whether verbally or online (social media, video game chats, etc). These comments are taken seriously whether they are made in school or out of school. We will follow up and follow through on school discipline. This type of talk is unacceptable.

7. DO: Go back over the Student Handbook with your child: South Walnut https://bit.ly/3pMbBVq, Middle School/High School https:// bit.ly/30cHs8P.

You will find the handbook acknowledgement form, and electronic signature release by logging into the PowerSchool Parent Portal here https://psbangor.vbisd.org Once logged in, click "Forms". If you don't have a username and password for the PowerSchool Parent Portal, please contact your student's school office. In addition, we will go back over our school training in A.L.I.C.E. A.L.I.C.E stands for:

Alert - Alert is your first notification of danger. Maintain good situational awareness to overcome normalcy bias and ensure the best response to a critical incident or violent intruder. Lockdown – Barricade the room.

Inform - Communicate the violent intruder's location and direction in real-time. To do this, pass on real-time information using any means necessary Examples are video surveillance 911 calls and PA announcements.

Counter – Not to be confused with fighting, this step involves creating noise, movement, distance and distraction. Its intent is to reduce the shooter's ability to shoot accurately.

Evacuate - Safe and strategic evacuation techniques get people out of harm's way. Understand how your current environment impacts your ability to evacuate and discover the safest ways to do so.

We know the experience at Oxford High School adds an emotional challenge for all students, families and staff. Please reach out to your our school mental health team members:
